Frederick Dwayne Hubbard, born April 7th, 1938, in Indianapolis, Indiana, was widely regarded as the most gifted jazz trumpeter of the post-bebop '60s and '70s.

An exceptional talented virtuoso performer, Hubbard's rich full tone was never lost, even when he played dazzlingly fast passages. One of the greatest hard bop trumpeters of our time, he was perhaps one of the greatest technical trumpet players ever to play in the jazz idiom and arguably the most influential.


